Why Declare a Climate Emergency?

249 councils including EBC have declared their commitment to becoming Carbon Neutral by 2030

Half of the UK's councils in 8 months

## What does it mean?

## 1.5 degrees - IPCC report

- Unavoidable fact that global warming is happening
- Humans have increased the amount of Greenhouse Gasses in the atmosphere
- Limiting cumulative emissions requires either reducing net global emissions of long-lived greenhouse gases to zero before the cumulative limit is reached or net negative global emissions (anthropogenic removals) after the limit is exceeded (IPCC)
- If we can we give ourselves time to adapt
- It won't be enough for some, at current levels by 2035 35% of the world's lifeforms will be facing extinction



## Carbon Budget

- To meet Paris "pursue ... 1.5°C" to "well below 2°C" commitment
- From 2020 the global carbon budget is ~700GtCO2 (to 2100 & beyond)
- In 2018 global CO2 emissions were ~43GtCO2
- i.e. under 16 years of current emissions



- Need to reduce CO2 at 10-13% p.a. starting now
- A total reduction of around 70-80% by 2030
- fully decarbonised energy by around 2035-40



## What to do?

- Richest 10% are responsible for 50% Greenhouse Gas emissions (Carbon Footprint)
- Poorest 50% are responsible for 10% of GHG
- Fair budgets are set for developing societies

## Surplus Food

- 30% of Global Food is wasted 8% GHG
- 22% of this is HFW
- Developed countries consumer/household
- Developing countries manufacture/storage
- Surrey 31kg per capita (2017)
- WRAP Love Food Hate Waste campaign, wrap.org.uk
- UK 156kg per capita (2017)
- BUT: Surrey worst offenders for Energy -Flights, Cars and Energy



## Feeding the World



• The EAT-Lancet Commission on Food, Planet, Health brought together 37 world-leading scientists from across the globe to answer this question:

Can we feed a future

Can we feed a future population of 10 billion people a healthy diet within planetary boundaries?

 YES... incredible research, major changes but this it is possible
